### An impression of the men's group in Broek op Langedijk



One Saturday morning, 6:30 AM, at the end of October, and still dark outside.

More than 30 men are coming in, almost in a routine chronological order. They come for the CBS Bible Study, every other week, today for the 247<sup>th</sup> time for this group!

Regular patterns with good habits. A long table is set up, as they start with breakfast. There is a lot of lively talk. Men with different backgrounds regarding their phase of life, their work, and their churches, and with ages ranging from 20 till over 70.

When the clock strikes 7 AM, breakfast is finished and all the men go to one of the 5 small groups. Each small group leader is guiding his group through the questions of the homestudied part of the letter to the Romans.



The 'Questions for home study' are faithfully prepared. The men have experienced the value of it. The CBS method has a good structure and it has proven itself. The discussions dig deep and touch the emotions. Personal stories and witnesses are shared in the safety of the small group. It is a privilege to experience God's presence.

When the church bell strikes 8 o'clock, it is time for all to go to the big room for the plenary closure talk by one of the leaders. The part-song before the talk brings rest, and helps to focus. At 8:30 AM they close with a song and prayer. What a blessing, this group existing for already so long and men looking forward to meeting each other for Bible study again and again.
